Leah was the inaugural (2022) recipient of CinemaFemme's Halyna Hutchins Producer Award for their work building a safe, inclusive set on the short film Rough River Lake. From 2022-2024, Leah was Drama at The Faculty Chair Kentucky Governor's School for the Arts. Leah was awarded a 2025 artist grant and residency from KY Foundation of Women to and support research development on creative writing projects. His crime documentary Charm City was shortlisted for the Oscars, and earned global theatrical release in 2018. He also served as DP on Netflix's Emmy-nominated documentary series Keepers. He works with National Geographic, HBO, PBS, and Oprah Winfrey's OWN.

Erik Hall

musician since child-hood, Erik has gone on to play, record and tour solo as In Tall Buildings, plus with NOMO, Wild Belle, His Name is Alex and Lean Year at top festivals like SXSW and Lollapalooza.

As a film composer, Erik scored and produced music for *The Night Clerk* (2020) and contributed music to *The Mountain* (2018)

He's released three albums as In Tall Buildings (Western Vinyl), and in 2020 the same label released his solo re-creation of Steve Reich's *Music for 18 Musicians*, which won the 2021 Libera Award for Best Classical Record. He has worked on numerous records for other artists.


